In Greek (the original language of the New Testament), the word *Christos* (Christ) begins with the letter "X," or chi. Here's what it looks like: Χριστός.

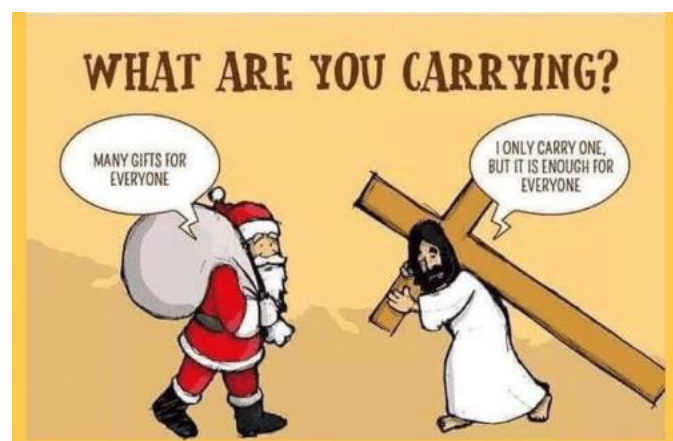
As a community, may I invite you to join in together on:
